Brazil's tribes

- •1500: 11 million people in 2,000 peoples
 - → 90% wiped out by diseases
- •2019: 900,000 people in 305 tribes
 - → biggest people >50,000 relatives
 - → smallest people = 1
 - → 100 uncontacted tribes (Amazon)
- Largest forested indigenous territory of the planet (Brazil / Venezuela) → Home of the Yanomami





The Yanomami

- * 35.000 members
- * Largest relatively isolated tribe in South America living in the rainforest and mountains of northern Brazil and southern Venezuela
- * At least 3 groups live uncontacted (moxateteu)











- * "Development projects"








Yanomami - What we do
