



WWF includes on its board people from some of the most environmentally damaging corporations (mining, oil, etc.).












WWF collaborates in the carving up of indigenous lands to profitmaking corporations.

It then "partners" with destructive logging companies inside "protected zones."






WWF calls its partner in Cameroon, Rougier, an "integrated forest and trade company."

In fact, Rougier is a logging company. Here's one forest it cleared.





Spain King Juan Carlos sorry for Botswana hunt trip




The king (R) standing next to a dead elephant on an earlier safari in Botswana

#### Z The big conservation organizations don't speak out against tribal evictions. They partner with government, industry and tourism and destroy the environment's best allies.






They say they're powerless to get things right – it's all too complicated.




