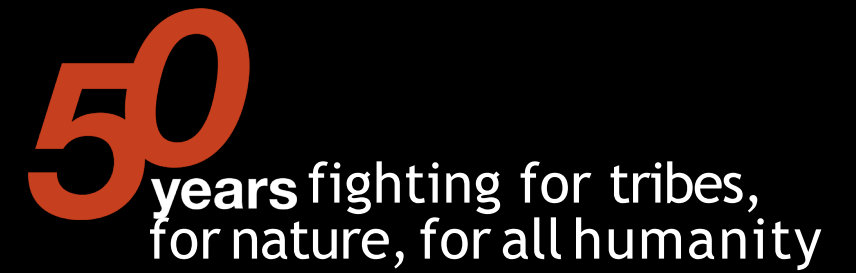

In fact, Rougier is a logging company. Here's one forest it cleared.

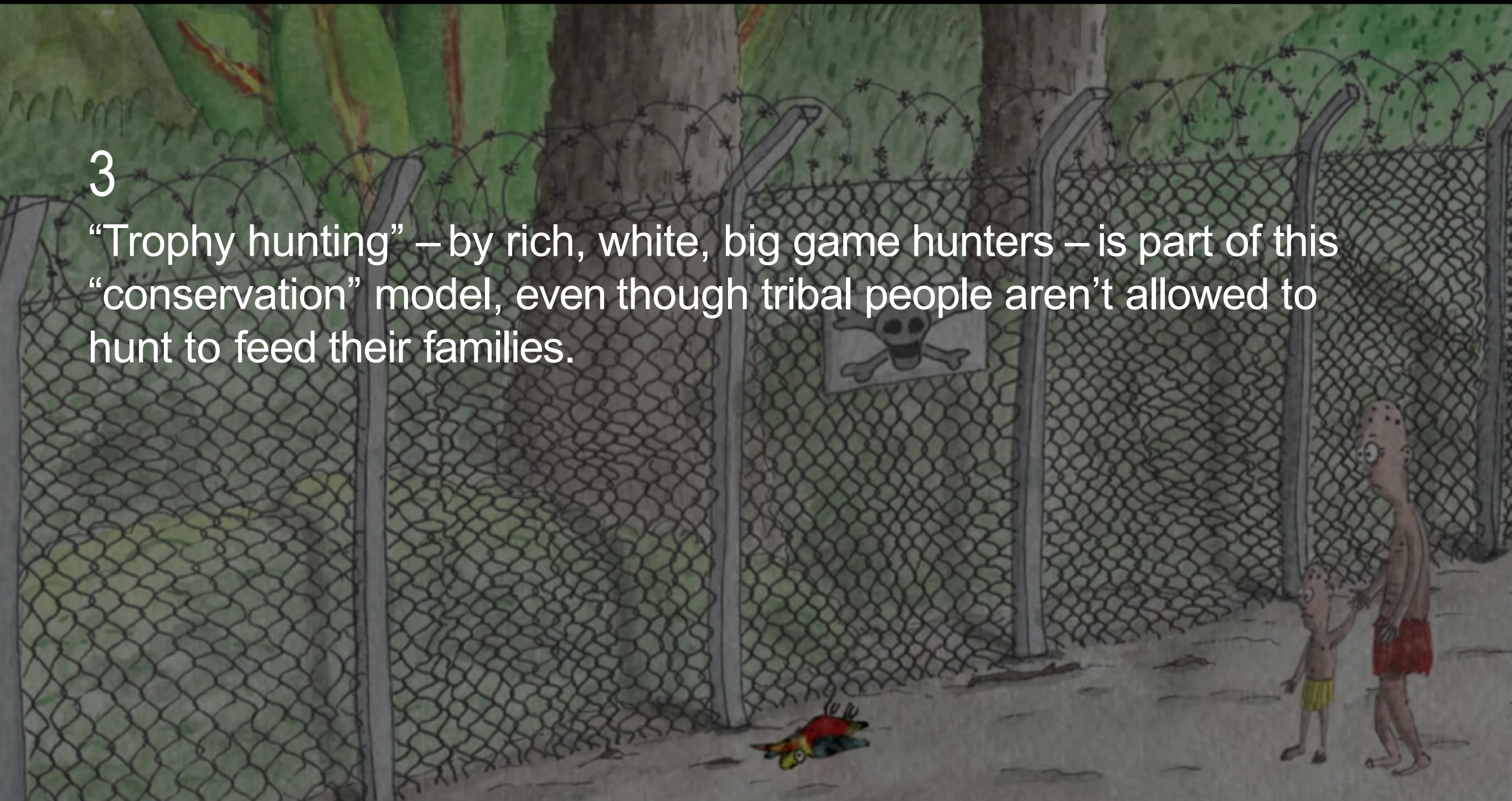

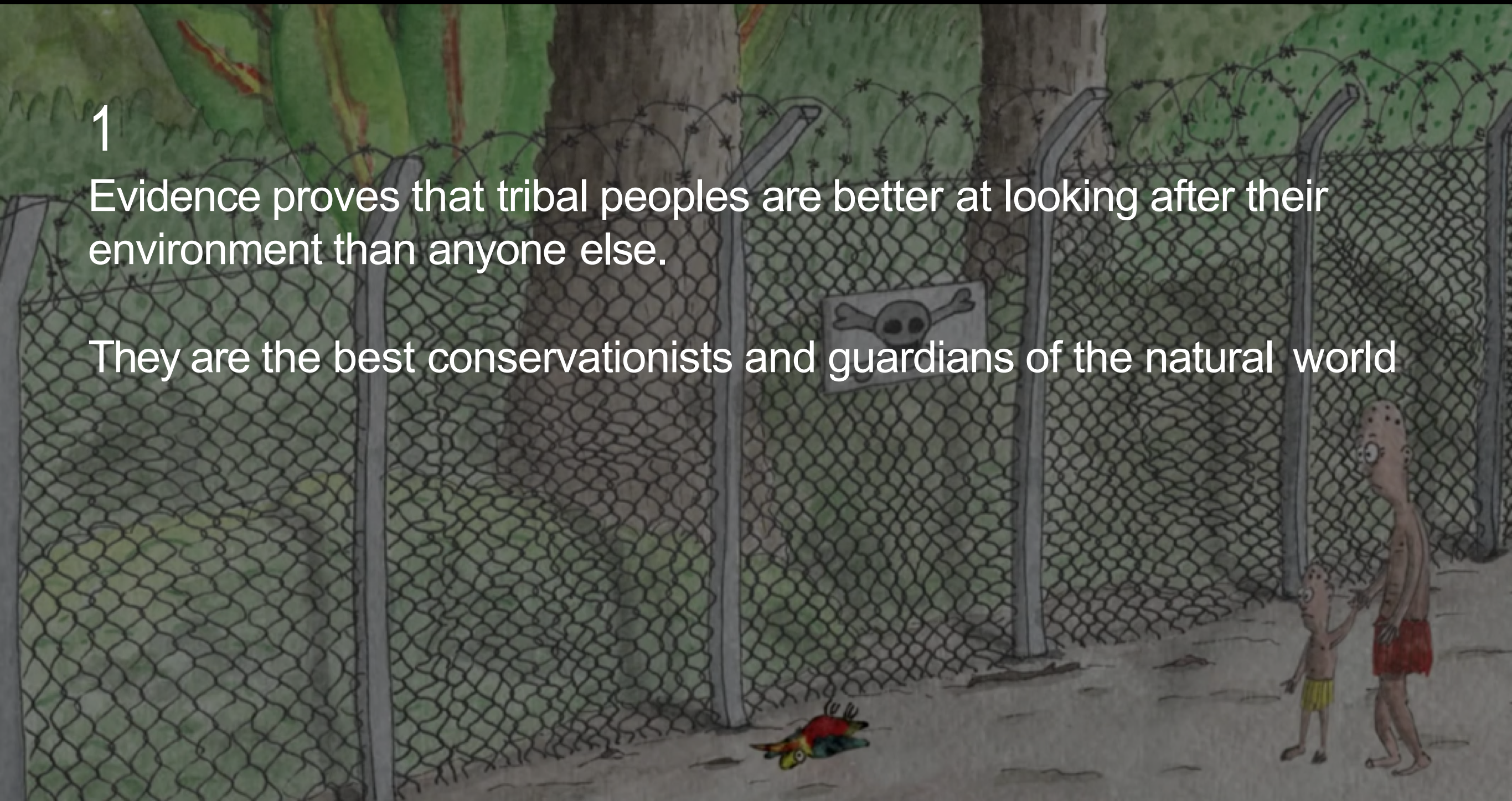

They partner with government, industry and tourism and destroy the environment's best allies.

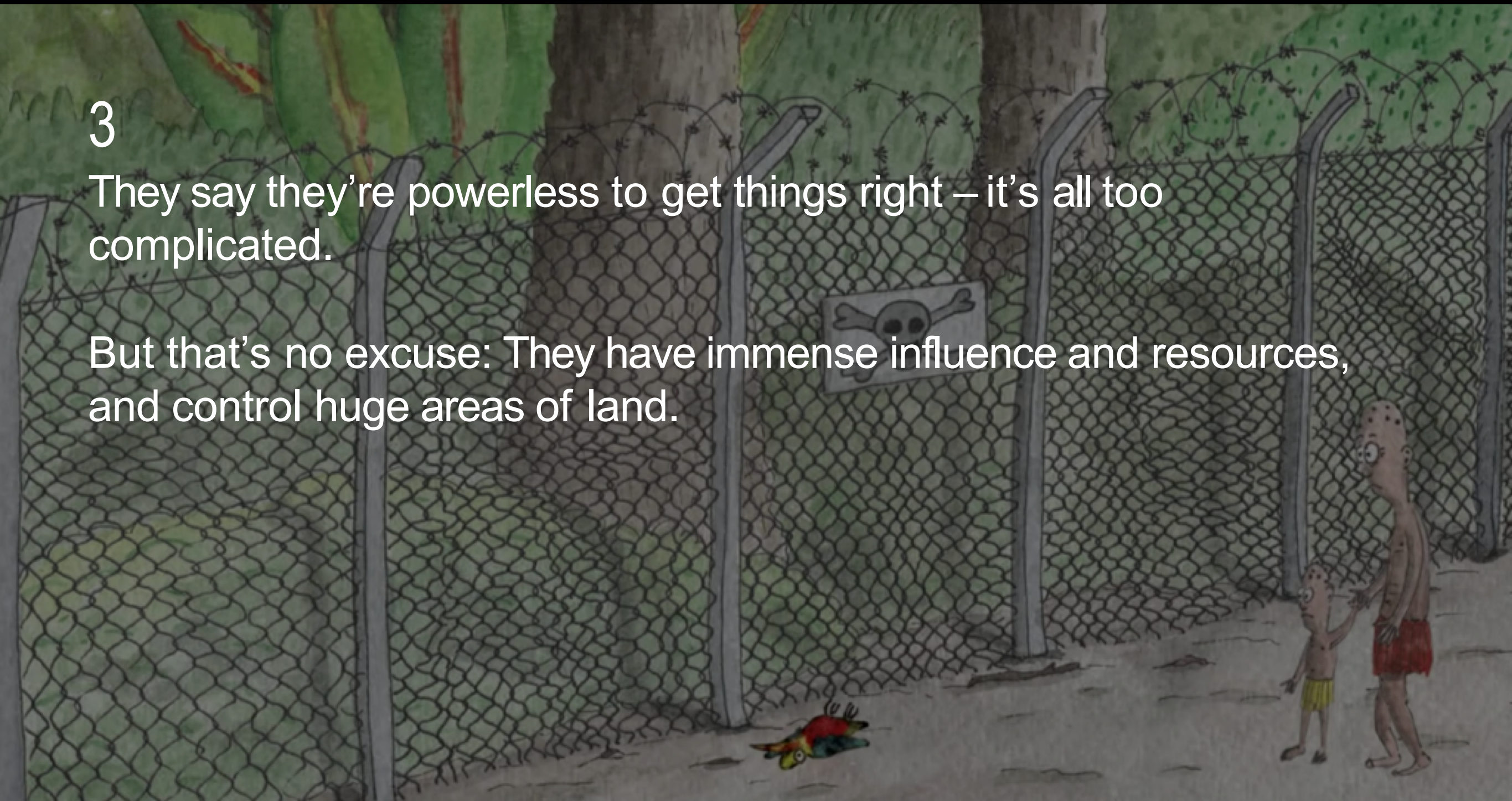




## 3 things to take away

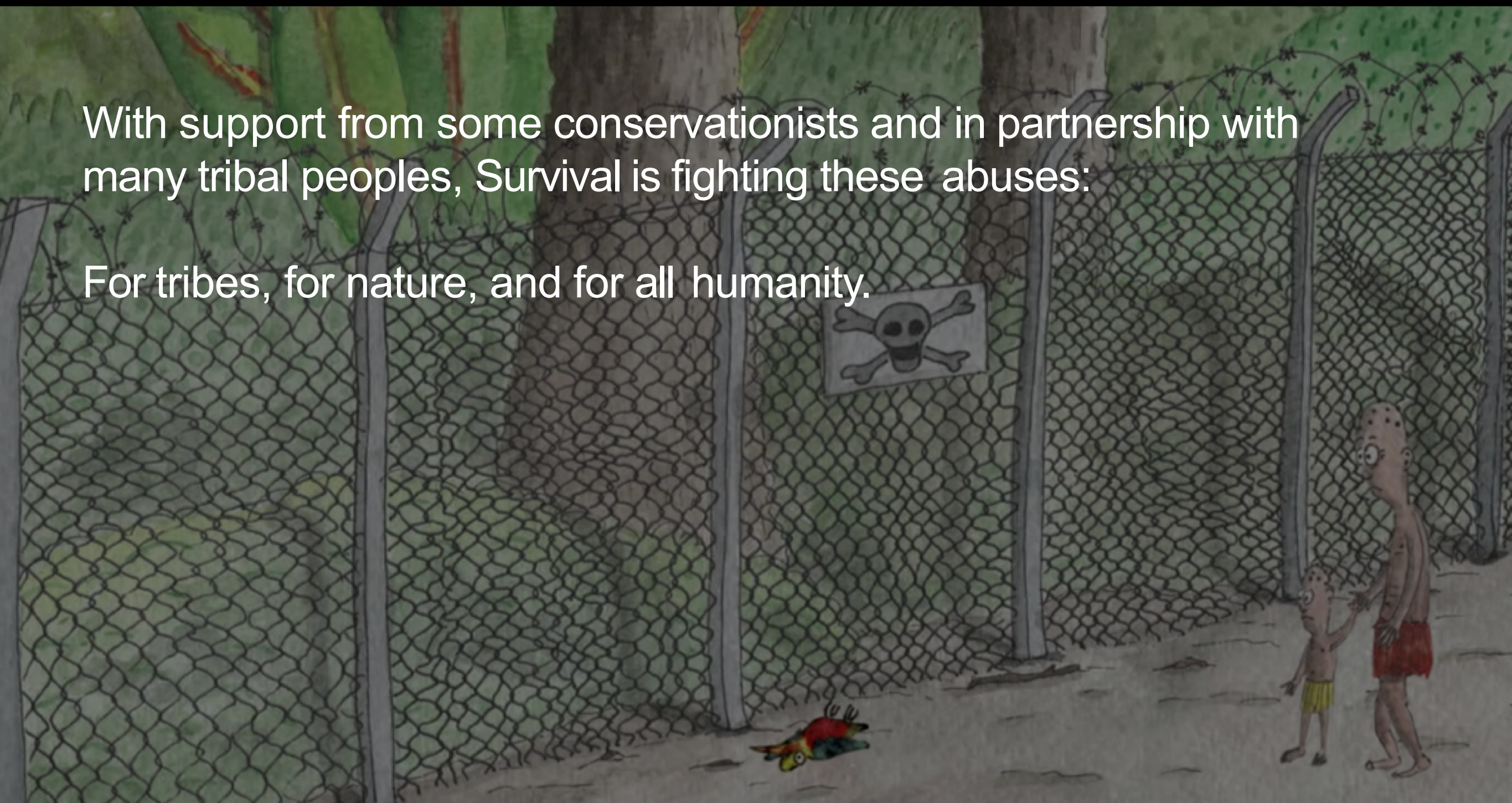
